Field Trips

Looking for a unique learning experience for your students? Look no further than NMIH!

School field trips are available for grades K-12. All field trips are 2-hour experiences that are led by a trained Museum Educator. Students are guided through a curated and interactive tour of the Museum galleries. The experience may include S.T.E.A.M. hands-on activities, facilitated discussions and debates, oral history, and workshops.

Field Trips are easily adjusted to fit the learning needs of your group! These experiences enable students to connect with history in a deeper way, are curriculum-based, and practice the 4 "C"s of 21st Century Skills: Critical Thinking, Communication, Creativity, and Collaboration.

COST: \$15 per student; Chaperones are free at the rate of 1 per 10 students; each additional chaperone is \$5; Bus drivers are free of charge for museum admission
WHEN: Monday- Friday between 9 am- 5 pm EST (Federal holidays excluded).
WHERE: National Museum of Industrial History, 602 East 2nd St, Bethlehem
PARTICIPANTS: 5-60 students; We accommodate groups of up to 20 students per Museum Educator, however we can have up to 3 simultaneous groups (60 participants total). We ask that there is a minimum of 1 teacher or chaperone with each group of 20 students.

BARNETTE EDUCATION CENTER ADD-ONS:

- To reserve the Barnette Education Center as a space for lunch is an additional \$50 for up to one hour of usage
- The rent the Barnette Education Center for any other purpose is at the rate of \$120 per hour

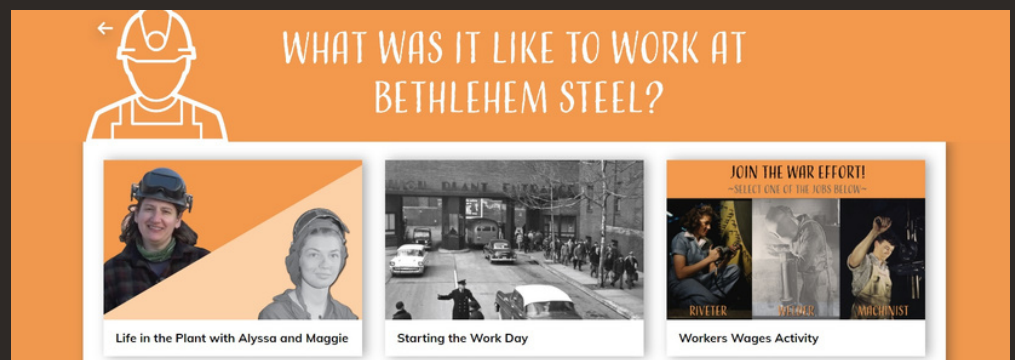
Digital Resources

You'll get unlimited access to one of our Digital Resources for the month of your choosing. Using a web browser, project, or screen-share the resource during class and take your students through the experience together or have them access it independently.

Each Digital Resource Includes:

- In-depth highlights of NMIH collections and artifacts
- Prompts, activities, and videos that engage your students in local and national history and S.T.E.A.M. learning
- A facilitation guide for teachers with suggested ways to use this Digital Resource with a group of students
- Over 5 hours of curriculum-based materials
- Audio narration to support multi-modal learning





COST: \$100 for unlimited month-long usage for one classroom.
